STUDENT FELLOWS PROGRAM

MFI's Student Fellows Program is an interconnected program of academic study, college counseling, career mentoring, and spiritual discipleship. The program affords high school, home-schooled, and college students transformative experiences in service of MFI's long-term vision of a Maryland where God is honored, life is cherished, families flourish and religious liberty thrives. The program is directed by MFI Academic Advisory Board member Professor Joseph Prud'homme (Ph.D., Princeton).

Open to high school and college-aged students from across the state of Maryland, the program's highlights include:

- Enrollment in an **on-line college course** offered by **Grove City College**—one of the nation's most distinguished Christian universities. Taught by Professor Prud'homme, this course awards full college credit transferable to universities throughout the country. The class explores Biblical conceptions of the state and the writings of many of the most prominent Christian thinkers on the relationship between faith and political power. It runs in the evenings from 6:00 to 8:30, Monday through Thursday, from June 1 through July 1. Cost: \$660.
- From August 16 through August 23 the Fellows attend a week-long series of two-hour **on-line workshops** that include lessons by MFI President Jeff Trimbath, MFI's lead lobbyist Jonathan Alexandre, and prominent current and retired state and federal officials. The workshops address in further depth the contemporary applications of the concepts explored in the college course.
- Throughout September, each Fellow meets in Annapolis over a free meal for in-person meetings with MFI staff focused on **career preparation and college admissions** with the goal of enhancing each Fellow's resume and high school activities to maximize career success and admission to top colleges.
- The Fellows engage in two **on-line workshops**: first, in October, a seminar on Logic; second, in November, a seminar Apologetics.
- In mid-December, Fellows meet in downtown Annapolis for a guided tour of the Maryland Statehouse, and then convene with their parents, MFI senior staff, ministers from across the state, and leaders in Maryland government for a catered celebratory **dinner and commissioning ceremony**, at which time certificates will be awarded to each Fellow.
